#### **Grammar Differences**

In British English、people use more present perfect tense (現在完了形) than past simple tense (単純過去形).

Example (例):

He has already eaten lunch. He already ate lunch.

In British English, people often use "*got*". In American English, people prefer to use "*gotten*".

Example (例):

You've got taller!

You've gotten taller!

In British English, people often use "Shall I ...?" to offer to do something and/or "Shall we ..." to make a suggestion. In American English, people often use *"Should/Can I ...?"*.

Example (例):

Shall I open the window? Can I open the window?

### **Pronunciation Differences**

Some English words are pronounced (said) differently. This means the words sound different.
